STEM Star

Lana F has been representing Campbell High at the Curious Minds girls in STEM camp this week, she has been participating in lab work in an university setting creating a working water filter that could be used in a remote community with little to no electricity, a turbidity meter to test the water for particulates and to test for bacteria in water by 'plating up' agar plates for incubation and observation and have attended site visits to Advanced Instrumentation and Technology Centre, which will form part of Australia's new space agency. As part of the program Lana has attended lectures from Kate Harriden (water geologist at ANU) and Cathy Foley (Chief Scientist of the CSIRO and patron of the Curious Minds program.) The most important part of the program Lana has been paired with a STEM coach, Lana's coach is a scientist and researcher at ANU. Lana will be working with her coach over the next six months completing a project, which will be presented in the July follow up camp.
